

- 1910-11: At this time Stotfold St. Mary's played on The Green in a black and white stripes (players included Jack Busby, Tommy Ashwell and Walt Dean).
Over the Easter Holiday Stotfold had a busy time playing five matches, viz.: (Friday) Stotfold 7, Henlow 1 (scorers Saml 2, Ashwell 3, B. Pateman 2, Juniors 2, Caldecote 3. (Saturday) Henlow 1, Stotfold 2. Juniors 2, Shillington 0 (Cardell played well in goal).
(Monday) Stotfold 1, Luton Reliance 0 (scorer Saml); a few weeks before were defeated 9-0.
- 1911-12: First Cup won by Stotfold, when they defeated Potton 1-0 for the Biggleswade & District League Championship at Potton; the scorer was Ernie Tripfow. The first Committee was then formed (no record of names), as there were no records kept.
- 1911-12: Stotfold now meeting with success and 3rd top of Junior League. (December 6) J. Hyde represented Stotfold at Junior League meeting.
- 1914: A trophy competed for now was the Black Cup (Sir Arthur Black, M.P. for Mid Beds).
Like many of the players of this era, many enlisted for the duration of the Great War (1914-18).
- 1916: A Charity match was held on Smith's Meadow (Stotfold v. Royal Engineers) and Jack Busby arrived home from France on leave on the Friday and took part in the game on Saturday. Proceeds were in aid of "The Biggleswade Chronicle's British Prisoners of War Fund."
- 1920: Stotfold, still competing in the Biggleswade and District League, was honoured when they were the first Bedfordshire side to be invited to compete in the Scott Gatty Cup Competition for Huntingdonshire clubs.
- 1919-20: Stotfold Athletic returned to Biggleswade & District League after the War and were runners-up. Also the Club's first entry in the Beds. Senior Cup. A heavy defeat in the first game of the season when beaten 17-1 by Henlow in a League game.
The Club invited to compete in the Scott Gatty Cup, and after a disputed goal in the first game against Brampton (Eynesbury) the replay was at Hinchinbrooke Park (Hunts). A special train was chartered from Arlesey Station for the large support from Stotfold to see their team win 4-1. Freddie Gentle broke his leg in the first half of this game. In the final, after a good performance, Stotfold lost 4-2 to Raunds Town (Northampton).
- 1920-21: Reached the semi-final, only to lose to Raunds Woodbine 1-0 in the Scott Gatty Competition.
- 1923-24: Stotfold Athletic again in the final of the Scott Gatty competition (drew 0-0 with St. Ives Town, then lost the replay 1-0 at St. Neots—a good performance).
Stotfold Rovers competed in the Letchworth & District League and had the wonderful analysis of having played 19, Won 18, Drew 1, Lost 0, Goals for 165, against 9; Points 37. This League only lasted a few seasons and was disbanded soon after the organiser, Mr. Constable, of Letchworth, gave up the secretaryship.
- 1924-25: The team which won the Beds. Minor Cup at The Chase, Arlesey:—W. Jeffs; Alf Cardell, Len Smith; Sid Rollins, H. Shepherd, Stan Albon; E. Howard, S. Millard, Tom Carter, Ron Shepherd, M. Payne.
- 1933-34: Stotfold Old Boys were Champions of Divisions II and III of the Biggleswade & District Leagues.
When Edgar Woods, who was the force behind the Biggleswade and District League died, most of the league and cup competitions were disbanded.
- 1935-36: Stotfold Hornets competed in Division I of the North Herts. League.
With the Second World War looming up there was very little Senior football in the village. There was the Stotfold Juniors, who competed in the North Herts. League around 1940.
- 1946-48: With the war over, local sportsmen were now busy trying to reorganise a football team, and after S. "Chelsea" Charles (at his own expense), with Paddy Dalley and Bernard Allen, started the Stotfold Youth side, who played friendly games only under the name of Stotfold joined the North Herts. League. It was after this period Bruce Clark came on the scene and sent out circulars to put the club on a sound basis both financially and in forming a Committee to start up the present Stotfold Club.
- 1948-49: Stotfold promoted to North Herts. (Div. D). Reserves competing in Div. III. This set up continued with both clubs beginning to show their strength until the entry into the South Midlands League.
At this period Stotfold had been playing on the Hitchin Road Recreation Ground.
- 1951-52: This was the first season the club competed in the South Midlands League and in Div. II finished 2nd with 43 points from 26 games.
The Reserves were in the North Herts. League.
- 1952-53: As runners-up Stotfold now competed in Division I (S.M.L.) and were 5th with 37 points from 30 games.
The Reserves gained promotion to the Premier Division of the North Herts. League.
- 1953-54: Stotfold were League Champions, S.M.L. (Div. D), 45 points, 30 games.
In this the last season of the Reserves in the N.H.L. (Premier Division) they reached the Semi-final of the North Herts. Benevolent Shield.
- 1954-55: Stotfold were promoted to their present League, the Premier Division of the S.M.L., and finished 6th with 23 points from 24 games. They also reached the final of the Beds. Senior Cup for the first time.
Reserves, now in S.M.L. Reserve Section, became Champions. They were also winners of the Biggleswade Knock-Out Competition.
