

- 1955-56: Stotfold's Premier side finished runners-up with 44 points from 26 games.
- 1956-57: Stotfold dropped to 5th Place with 38 points from 26 games.
- 1957-58: Stotfold's Premier side finished runners-up with 35 points from 26 games.
- The Reserves were Champions of their League.
- 1958-59: This was Stotfold's best season, having reached the 1st Round Proper of the F.A. Amateur Cup, after beating Eastbourne (away) 1-0, the scorer being "Duke" Dear but then, under Arctic conditions, lost at home to Erith & Belvedere 3-1 before a huge crowd. Cheque from Amateur Cup Pool £155 2s. 3d.
- Stotfold were again runners-up with 44 points from 28 games. The Reserves were Champions for the second successive season.
- 1959-60: Stotfold still runners-up with 46 points from 28 games. Reserves complete a hat-trick as League Champions.
- 1960-61: Stotfold dropped to 3rd place with 40 points from 28 games. For the fourth successive time the Reserves were Champions.
- 1961-62: Stotfold kept their third place with 39 points from 28 games.
- 1960-61: Negotiations going on re "Roker Park." Stotfold Reserves now competing for Beds. Junior Cup (instead of the Intermediate Cup).
- 1961-62: Took lease of "Roker Park." October 1961. Ground ploughed, harrowed and scuffed for the playing area. After many hours of twitching and burning rubbish, the area was levelled and the grass seed sown.
- 1962-63: Stotfold dropped to 5th place in the S.M.L. Premier Division. Reserves finished runners-up in Reserve Section. Springtime saw "Roker Park" get its first cutting by C. Charles.
- Autumn—the fencing in of the ground completed.
- November—Entrance gates hung and pillars built by Charlie Shaw.
- Stotfold lost 5-4 in the final of the Beds. Senior Cup against Biggleswade at Ampthill.
- 1963-64: Stotfold runners-up with a near photo-finish in the Premier Division. Reserves surprisingly slumped to 8th place in the Reserve Section.
- January—Four Trustees appointed for Roker Park, namely: J. Forrester, W. Clegg, R. Longhurst and H. Sewell (until the A.G.M.).
- February—F.A. Amateur Cup Declaration. The Committee had no hesitation in recommending W. Clegg (Secretary), S. Pooley (Treasurer) and J. Forrester (Chairman) to sign the declaration before a Commissioner for Oaths within a week of receiving the Notice.
- Plans finalized for the new pavilion. Playing area surveyed for setting out by Lionel Taylor and Ken George. Gang-mower demonstrated with view to purchasing same.
- April—Tenders invited from six local builders.
- May 4-5—election of successful builders to tender was postponed pending two other tenders going out of the village. R. W. Smith Ltd. (Letchworth) was the successful applicant. The building of the pavilion was then held up for six months while awaiting news from the Ministry of Education and Science regarding a possible grant towards the pavilion. This was granted in November 1964, and at the time of going to press the builder was soon to make a start, which means that the ground should now be available for the opening of the 1964-65 season.
